

After meeting the staff we had a tour of the award winning Meditation and Indigenous Culture Centre and its nearby wetlands and re-created natural environment. I was blown away by both the sustainable design of the building and its surroundings. (See pictures at right)It was also inspiring to hear how the staff had integrated the use of this building into their curriculum. This provides a form of empowerment for students, specifically concentrating on years 9 and 12, which are recognised as the most stressful and challenging years of secondary school. Bill Thomas, head of sustainability at the school, shared his passion and explained the process of how they secured the design and raised the money and built the building for a total cost of \$153,000. This has inspired the members who attended to look at doing something similar – building an Empowerment Centre at Rosebud Secondary College.
