Another Feel Good Evening - Interplast Dinner – 'Changing Futures Together'



When Rotarians collaborate for a common cause, there's no stopping that momentum! Thank you to Rotary Mount Eliza for taking the lead on funding an Interplast team to Tonga (25 May – 3 June, 2023).

Those who attended the dinner at Mount Eliza on 15th August were able to hear first-hand how the team was able to

provide consultations for 59 patients and undertook 39 life-changing surgical procedures, while concurrently providing clinical training to 32 local surgeons, nurses and anaesthetists.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) – Learning More

Deb Mellett, our Guest Speaker on 16th August, is a Gurindji Woman from the Northern Territory who grew up on Larrakeyah land (Darwin). She explained that she learned cultural protocol from her grand-mother before moving to the Mornington Peninsula some 25 years ago. Deb is currently the General Manager at Nairn Marr Djambana (Gathering by the Bay) in Frankston and she talked about her work there, citing some current day statistics as well as the historical context from an Aboriginal viewpoint. She was supported by Marg D'Arcy, the Manager of Rye Community House, also our guest.

Go looking for members:

As a result of your members identifying prospective new members you will have the names of many potential members, so make up a hit list of potential members. You'll need their given and last names, address, phone number, e-mail address, phone number and, if possible, their partner's name. Remember, the more information you have, the better armed you are to recruit people

Teach members to make prospects feel special:

Specifically that means ensuring that somebody looks after the person, introduces them around and explains what's happening when programs and activities are being discussed.

For a new visitor even knowing about the Rotary invocation or a toast is a new experience and needs to be explained as it occurs. Don't leave them in the dark! No matter what's happening a member should be at that prospect's elbow explaining what's going on.

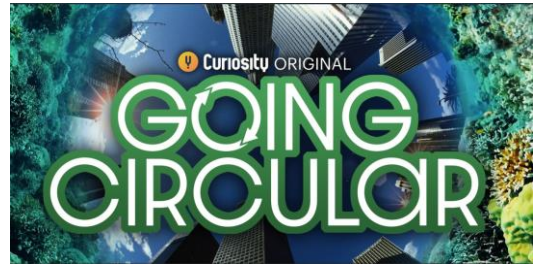
