Last Friday at the **Presidents dinner held at the Mulgrave Country Club**, DG Colin presented our Club with a District 9815 Silver Club Excellence award for 2024/25, which I will share with Club members at our first meeting.

Receiving this award is testament to the work which is achieved by our small, but dedicated members and the informed, corporate management which ensures an excellent financial reward for our Enterprises.

There were Bronze, Silver and Gold certificates presented. Marked against 10 criteria which formed the Club Action plan, reports had to be compiled and submitted quarterly. 11 Clubs featured in the Gold category and we were 1 of 18 who were successful in the Silver category. Unfortunately I didn't capture the number of Clubs in the Bronze category.

### **Donations this month:**

Funding Grants approved at the RCRR INC (Club) board meeting on 28th May, totalled \$18,000.

- Tootgarook Primary School, \$3,000 new outdoor benches/ seats for the school grounds (work to be completed by Rosebud & District Men's Shed)
- Rye Sports and Social club \$5,000 to lift our club sponsorship funding for the Rye Gift carnival in Jan 2026. In previous years we have sponsored \$2,500 but next year we have committed \$2,500 for the Junior Rye Gift plus \$2,500 for the Senior aspects of the carnival. We are very pleased to sponsor a significant Rye event which is the third largest Athletic Carnival in Victoria. Very good PR for our club and Rotary.
- Midwife Medical Hut, Ingin in Southern Highlands of PNG \$2,000 This is a Frankston & Morn Pen Community Group Rotary project lead by RC Mt Martha, who have done other projects in this remote area of PNG. The project cost is \$15,000 and the current Midwife will be able to train other midwives in the region.
- Rotary District 9660 NSW Flood disaster relief appeal \$3,000. This is a national appeal which has gone out to all districts in Australia. It is a full-on Rotary lead and managed project to assist victims of the recent floods. Local Volunteer Rotarians will allocate these funds to help people recover from the floods.
- We have completed the Rotary Hardship Scholarships with both Rosebud Secondary College and Padua
   College \$2,000. The colleges have selected 4 students with financial needs to benefit from these funds which
   will pay for excursions and camps plus VCE school books.
- RC Dromana -Tiny House Project to assist homelessness. You will remember that our club agreed to pledge \$3,000 to this project which has an overall cost of \$75,000.
   Well, the project is now fully funded by Rotary Clubs and has started. We will now be able to complete our contribution of \$3,000.

#### Donations in kind from our Warehouse - \$31,470.

Not only does our warehouse offer us the opportunity to create a resource for employment opportunities for some of our local community members and a fabulous example of reusing, repurposing and recycling, Treasurer Philip mentioned at our last Board meeting, that the Rotary Warehouse, Donations in Kind for the year to end of April works out to be \$31,470.

This dollar value equates to the quantum of household goods, clothing, etc provided on application, free of charge to those in the greatest need. It's so wonderful that we have the ability to help people in real need of support here on the Peninsula and surrounding areas.

## Drought Relief funding for farmers in Western Victoria -

DG Colin Byron has circulated an appeal through RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service) to Clubs in our District, to contribute funds to District 9870 in Western Victoria.

We can discuss this at our next meeting, with our Club Board now able to consider quantifying some support to our farmers.

And finally. What a ride. It has been an honour to serve as your President this year. Thank you for your unwavering support, commitment and the shared passion that drives our service. Together, we have truly made a difference and witnessed the magic of Rotary time and time again.

I wish Sandra and her incoming Board the very best for their coming year. We already "Unite for Good" and share the camaraderie of a strong Club, which I know will continue.

#### • Value of Inclusion:


