

Rotary is where people help people - and achieve extraordinary things.


Rotary brings together a global network of volunteer leaders who dedicate their time and talent to tackle the world's most pressing humanitarian challenges.

HOW WE WORK

At Rotary, we work to create a positive impact by improving the wellbeing and lives of others. Working to a plan informed by research and reflecting our constantly changing world, we support people in our local community, across Australia and overseas. Sometimes this support may be a one-off, other projects continue year on year.

This support includes

- helping when disasters strike, e.g. supporting bushfire, cyclone, flood and drought-affected communities, and the war in Ukraine.

SUPPORT FOR OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY



As an integral part of the Southern Peninsula community, Rotary Rosebud-Rye club members provide practical support to help others, and assist in a range of local community events and activities aimed at creating a more cohesive community, strengthening community ties and promoting a sense of belonging.

New Year's Eve BBQ

Club members run an annual BBQ at Rosebud Police Station for around 100 **first responders** before they head out for a 'big night on the beat'

Hardship Scholarships

Funding to support students at **Rosebud Secondary College** with the books and equipment they need

Wellness Pavilion

Seed funding to enable the project to get off the ground, followed by additional funding towards completion of the Wellness Pavilion at **Rosebud Secondary College**

Wellness Hub

Funding support towards creating a Wellness Hub at **Eastbourne Primary School,** for use by the school and the wider community

Girl Guides Rosebud

Funding to create an all abilities toilet for wide range of users of the Rosebud Hall

Local Event Support

Assistance with car parking and take-away food at the local Car Show, Southern Peninsula Amateur Radio Club (SPARC) and is a long-term Platinum Sponsor of the Peninsula Film Festival

Early Learning Equipment

Funding to purchase much needed equipment as part of the update for **Rye Community Childcare**

Homelessness

Funding support for homelessness services on the southern Peninsula through Southern Peninsula Community Support

Mentoring for Young People

Building on from funding for the Wellness Pavilion, funding to create and run the 'BEAM' Mentoring Program at **Rosebud Secondary College**

MENTORING

'BEAM' Mentoring Program at Rosebud Secondary College funding and mentors - just one hour a week (term time) can help a young person change their life's outcomes

YOUNG CHANGE AGENTS Program - working with local students to develop their problem solving skills, and develop their entrepreueurship

SOME ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAMS

ROTARY YOUTH LEADERSHIP AWARDS (RYLA): (18-30yo) - 6 day residential camp develops personal development, leadership, and teamwork. In-classroom theory activities and outdoor practical activities.

ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAM OF ENRICHMENT (RYPEN): (14-17yo) 3-day residential camp builds confidence, increases self-awareness, teaches decision making skills, develops leadership, and allows the participants to create friendships.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS ASSEMBLY (MUNA) Conference for Years 10, 11 & 12 students where, representing their assigned country, debate other countries in a UN-like setting. Encourages young people to learn about other countries. develops an understanding of the United Nations, debating skills, gaining self-confidence in public speaking and leadership. Years 11 and 12 students who are interested in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) come together for a 2-week camp in January, to learn from science professionals, tour university facilities, visit laboratories, and meet industry leading STEM companies.













SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE INTERNATIONALLY

International Service expands Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and promotes world understanding and peace.

Rosebud-Rye supports a number of projects, some of which are:

Polio Plus. Rotary has been working to eradicate polio worldwide for over 30 years. Incredible progress has been made to reduce polio by more than 99.9% - and we continue to support this effort.

Water and Sanitation Programs, including the funding of two Sky Hydrants which provide cheap, continuous clean water for communities in the Philippines

Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM). 20 years ago Malaria killed a child every 30 seconds. Considerable progress has been made in preventing, diagnosing and treating malaria and deaths have fallen by 60%.

Interplast. Teams of volunteer plastic and reconstructive surgeons, anaesthetists, nurses and allied health professionals provide life changing surgery and medical training in 17 Asia Pacific countries. The latest team, fully funded by Rotary Clubs on the Mornington Peninsula, has recently returned from their work in Tonga.

Rotary Garden Project at Koshish - a mental health and psychosocial support, centre in Nepal. Mental illness in Nepal is highly stigmatised; people die from lack of care and are often abandoned by their families when they cannot cope. Rotary is funding a sustainable garden project for Koshish patients to grow their own food, initially saving money, and ultimately to sell fresh food and raise additional funds for the Centre.

ENHANCING OUR ENVIRONMENT

New BBQ Shelter

Late in 2022, Rotary Rosebud-Rye joined forces with the Capel Sound Foreshores Committee with 50/50 funding to build a new BBQ Shelter on the Capel Sound Foreshore.

The aim of the project? More people to enjoy the beautiful surroundings and if needed, a cooking amenity for local people who may be living rough.

The new shelter, a rest stop alongside the bike path, adds another 'piece in the puzzle' to the Peninsula Trail.

Peninsula Trail

The Peninsula Trail is a walking and cycling network that extends over 100 kms, linking the Peninsula and beyond. The project is a transformational opportunity to showcase the many attractions of the Mornington Peninsula. When complete, the Trail will offer a continuous off-road cycling and walking track around the Peninsula. Each of the eight Rotary Clubs on the Peninsula are involved, together with the Mornington Peninsula Shire, contributing various aspects of the project within their locality.

- 3. You will be assigned a Mentor for your orientation and support, and a date will be set for your Induction to the Club.




